

Worship Services in the Backyard

June 14 & 21 @ 9:00am

We are excited to re-gather the next two Sundays in our backyard! We will meet, weather permitting, on the 14th and 21st of June and meet online only Sunday June 28th via Facebook Live. Our Facebook Live service at 11am continues every Sunday. We will keep you informed on plans for July and August as the reopening team continues to meet, evaluate, and discuss.

Here's what you need to know:

- ⇒ Bring your own lawn chairs or blankets (and your morning coffee)
- ⇒ The small blue flags in the yard are “spots” for family groups. They represent the center of an imaginary 8ft diameter circle. Find your own spot or let one of our greeters help.
- ⇒ All volunteers will wear masks while serving
- ⇒ The wearing of masks is suggested but not required
- ⇒ The pastor/worship leader will not be wearing a mask while preaching/singing
- ⇒ Observe social distancing of at least 6ft
- ⇒ No handshaking or hugging
- ⇒ We will sing, but for a shorter length of time. Links to the lyrics of the songs will be sent to you in the digital bulletin on Thursdays – use your phone to follow along or print them before you come.
- ⇒ There will be no childcare or children's church, however, we will have activity bags for kids during the service
- ⇒ The church building is not open for use except for bathrooms located at the back of the building
- ⇒ There will be a bathroom attendant to assist with cleaning and social distancing
- ⇒ Please do not come if you are not feeling well, or if you consider yourself to be in a high-risk category

We are tracking data as things progress in our area. Here is the most current basic data...

- For **Sauk County** - In the most recent 14-day period (ending May 30th), an average of 0.07% of tests were positive, well below the threshold of 5% positivity. This is also down from 1.32% positivity in the previous 14-day period (ending May 16th).
- **Sauk County** presently has 6 active cases of Covid-19
- There have been 12 people total that have been hospitalized in **Sauk County** for Covid-19
- On May 16th **Sauk county** had 77 cumulative cases of Covid-19 and as of June 7th there are 83 – an increase of 6 in the last 22 days
- On May 16th **Richland County** had 14 cumulative cases of Covid-19; as of June 7th, there are 14 – an increase of 0 in the last 22 days
- On May 16th **Iowa County** had 11 cumulative cases of Covid-19; as of June 7th, there are 17 – an increase of 6 in the last 22 days
